



Visiting Coaches & Instructors to Club Activities

The sole purpose of all equestrian riding clubs is to provide a safe environment where people from the local community can get together to share their love for horses. Many then go on to facilitate the education of its members in riding skills, horse care and ongoing appreciation, incorporating competitions and clinics in order to challenge their members and offer fulfilment.

With this comes the added responsibility for those on the committee to ensure any persons who are engaged to provide instruction to its members are appropriately qualified and experienced, and most importantly, the lesson being provided, suits the needs of the members.

As part of the clubs risk management and duty of care, you should also confirm or obtain proof that this visiting coach/instructor holds current Public Liability & Professional Indemnity insurance to cover their teaching activities.

If an incident were to happen during the arranged lesson or clinic and the visiting coach was uninsured, the injured party could seek damages from the committee for failure in its duty of care.

Automatic Cover

Where you hold an Equine Liability policy through Aon, clubs receive automatic cover for incidental tuition provided by an existing member of club which is provided on a voluntary, occasional basis at no charge.
